Helping kids and the environment

Rugby thanks the Pacific replaces diesel-generated power in remote Pacific island schools with solar or wind alternatives. The money saved on diesel is spent on education. For example, Rabi High School now has constant power and diverts over \$7000 per year from fuel to books, computers and other resources. That's a big deal considering the average family income is less than \$100 per month. This system will also save over 150 tonnes of carbon dioxide.

Pacific Islanders have contributed greatly to the quality, spectacle and spirit of rugby. Rugby thanks the Pacific is a practical and meaningful way of saying thanks.
